A public meeting was held to hear a Rezoning Application ZA002-21, Connor Cook, with respect to lands described as Concession 12, Part Lot 26 (locally known as 1443 Oakdale Road). The purpose of the rezoning is to rezone the newly created lot from Agriculture-2 (A2) zone, to Residential-4 (R4) following the severance application, granted by the Committee of Adjustment on August 3, 2021.
