Delegation 1: Al & Diane Bergsma

6:30pm – 6:40pm Retreat for First Responders & Farmers

Al and Diane Bergsma presented Council with a letter, proposing to build a 1000 square foot, 2-bedroom retreat cabin for first responders and farmers, in honor of their son who recently passed and who was also a dedicated volunteer firefighter. The proposed cabin would be built on a 50-acre bush lot owned by Al & Diane Bergsma, and would provide a welcoming place, free of charge, for first responders and farmers who need time to rest, recharge and heal while enjoying the surroundings of nature and solitude. The St. Clair Regional Conservation Authority, has *denied* the proposal to build inside the protected woodlot and further advised that no exemption would be considered. The Bergsma's provided five (5) letters of support from Wellspring Counselling Services, Lambton Cattlemen's Association, Lambton Farm Safety Association, Nancy Vandershaeef, and Monte McNaughton, MPP Lambton-Kent-Middlesex. Council was presented with a Planner's Report from Ezio Nadalin that provided background information and possible options to deal with building structures located at 6194 Water Street, Florence encroaching on the municipal road allowance. A survey was obtained in August 2020 that depicts multiple property encroachments including the drive shed of 2.35 metres and a primary home encroachment of 3.07 metres, both located on the west side of the property, as well as an encroachment for the front porch of .47 metres on the south side of Water Street. Several options were presented to Council for consideration. The following resolution was passed:
