Mr. Jackson presented his concerns with the proposal by York1 Environmental to create a solid waste facility north of Dresden, ON, located at 29831 Irish School Road. York1 Environmental Waste Solutions has proposed an amendment to the existing Environmental Compliance Approvals (ECA) for the subject property, being ECA No. A021304 and No. A020401. If approved, these amendments would allow the subject property to increase its waste processing site from 0.8-hectares up to 25 hectares and permit up to 6,000 tonnes daily of non-hazardous solid waste (i.e. construction and demolition waste) as well as 1,000 tones daily of residual waste on an annual average basis. Several concerns about this proposal include protecting nearby waterways, damage to local roads due to increased vehicle volume, as well as the negative impacts that the accompanying stench would have on local development. Mayor Broad shared with Council and Mr. Jackson that Jamie McGrail, who serves as a Chatham-Kent Councillor, is also the local representative for the Rural Ontario Municipal Association (ROMA), and that concerns or inquiries on this matter should be directed to Councillor McGrail. The Administrator-Clerk informed Council and Mr. Jackson that Dawn-Euphemia is awaiting official comment from Lambton County – Environmental Services on this matter, and that the opportunity for commenting on the proposal closes on March 16, 2024.
